



What is a Transparency Board

- Board with information on important school projects and achievement
- Visible to the whole community
- Jointly created by principals, teachers, parents, pupils & community representative

What do we see on the Transparency Board?

- Message of success: the status of projects in your school
- Information that allows the community to see and know what is happening in the school
- Information on how interested people can support the management and education at your school
- The responsible stakeholders with whom communities can engage for exchange of views (principal, Barangay Council, PTA)

Who can use the School Transparency Board?

DepED ARMM officials

- Instrument for school management to improve communication with parents, communities and other stakeholders

Principal and Teachers

- a platform to engage and induce creativity of parents and other stakeholders and thus increase the support for the school

Who can use the School Transparency Board?

Parents and Students

- better informed of what's going on in the school
- a space to communicate and express their views on issues in their school

Community

- space for dialogue and social audit
- encourages community members to provide more support to the schools while at the same time provides important information to discuss the needs of the school with the local government.
- Information about resource mobilization

- Transparency is a hallmark of good governance and forms part of the pillars of the ARMM Government and DepEd ARMM reforms. It accompanies the institutionalization of school based management.
- The Transparency Board is a simple tool for providing basic information on school management issues and disseminating accomplishments and success that foster the positive synergy of community participation and social accountability.
- DepEd ARMM with technical support from the Deutsche Gesellschaft fuer Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) – Fit for School Program conducted a pilot testing of Transparency Boards in selected elementary schools through DepEd ARMM Memo 055 Series of 2015
- The pilot testing has been successful and has positive impact on the undertakings of the selected schools
- Following the success of the pilot phase, DepEd ARMM would like to upscale the practice of using transparency boards in all its elementary schools.
- Each school is required to create the transparency board that should contain the following:
